Federal Shutdown Affecting Wildlife, Forest Product and Water Research Conducted in Madison Area

Centers for wildlife health, forest products research and water science are among the federal offices in the Madison area that have been closed due to the partial federal shutdown. The United States Geological Survey's National Wildlife Health Center on Madison's Southwest Side and the USGS' Wisconsin Water Science Center in Middleton are both closed. Both centers employ about 100 workers, many of them researchers, according to news reports and information on their websites. The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Forest Products Laboratory, located on the UW-Madison campus, also has been closed. Its employees include 60 research scientists. Read More

Timber Sales in National Forest Reach Level Not Seen Since Early 1990s

RHINELANDER — Timber sale levels on the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest reached 128.7 million board feet in fiscal year 2018, a level of sales not seen since the early 1990s. The 2018 fiscal year was also the sixth year in a row timber sales have increased in the forest. In 2017, the forest sold 120.5 million board feet of timber for an estimated value of \$7.72 million. Contractors also harvested 93.1 million board feet of timber valued at \$7.48 million. *Read More*

Hodag: The Outlandish Story of Wisconsin's Mythical Beast, on its 125th Birthday

RHINELANDER - The creature had a dragon's body, a fanged, snarly grin and smelled of "buzzard meat and skunk perfume," the Northwoods timberman wrote in a Rhinelander newspaper. Eugene Simeon Shepard described how the creature — "a terrible brute" of a hodag with the "strength of an ox," "the ferocity of a bear" and the "cunning of a fox" — tore apart the hunting dogs he and his friends tried to use to corner the beast. *Read More*

The Snapshot Wisconsin project is a citizen-based science initiative that uses trail cameras to document what's going on in the woodlands and other wild places when no one is looking. The project relies heavily on volunteers. The citizen scientists go through a training class, place a trail cam at an approved location, collect the images at least once every three months, upload the images to a website and classify the images. *Read More*

Visiting Woodchips Embedded Links to Webpages

Hyperlinks embedded into Woodchips allow readers to enjoy featured video or audio presentations as well full news articles or papers of interest with just a simple click of their mouse. The links appear at the end of an article (a news headline with one or two introductory sentences) typically as <u>Watch Video</u>, <u>Read More</u>, or <u>For More Information</u>.

To open the link, place your cursor over <u>Watch Video</u> or <u>Read More</u> and so on, and then left click on your mouse. That should open the link in a new window providing access to the specifically linked webpage.

With this issue of Woodchips, we will start listing the full URL to each hyperlink on a second page. If needed, the URL can be copied and pasted into your web browser address bar (also known as location bar or URL bar).
