Verso to Idle Wisconsin Rapids, Duluth Mills Indefinitely, Starting at the End of July

WISCONSIN RAPIDS – Verso will stop production at its paper mills at the end of July, leaving its future in Wisconsin Rapids uncertain. The company announced Tuesday it will indefinitely idle its paper mills in Wisconsin Rapids and Duluth, Minnesota, while "exploring viable and sustainable alternatives for both mills," according to a statement. Options include restarting the mills if market conditions improve, selling the mills or closing them permanently. *Read More*

The Madison Parks Division has a new tool for removing invasive plants in two of its parks this spring and summer: goats. About 40 adult and young adolescent goats from a local farm will be periodically put out to graze at Greenside Park and Acewood Conservation Park this spring and fall, with exact the timing dependent on weather conditions, analysis of existing vegetation and management goals. It's part of a trial program to manage invasive species and promote the establishment of native vegetation in the city's parks. *Read More*

Mequon, WI -- 19 years ago, a man just outside Milwaukee looked out at a square mile of farmland, and decided it needed to change. With a purchase and donation, a unique, 150-year transformation project began, called Mequon Nature Preserve. Now well-underway, conservationists will spend the next century-plus returning hundreds of acres to the forest, prairie and wetland it was in the early 1800's. It's an incredibly difficult task, made even tougher by an almost constant battle with invasive plants sprouting all over the chunk of land. Visiting Woodchips Embedded Links to Webpages

Hyperlinks embedded into Woodchips allow readers to enjoy featured video or audio presentations as well full news articles or papers of interest with just a simple click of their mouse. The links appear at the end of an article (a news headline with one or two introductory sentences) typically as *Watch Video*, *Read More*, or *For More Information*.

To open the link, place your cursor over <u>Watch Video</u> or <u>Read More</u> and so on, and then left click on your mouse. That should open the link in a new window providing access to the specifically linked webpage.

With this issue of Woodchips, we will start listing the full URL to each hyperlink on a second page. If needed, the URL can be copied and pasted into your web browser address bar (also known as location bar or URL bar).
