My Code 6A from the W.S.H.S (Wisconsin State Historical - Society, Madison), series #1074, Volume 1, Lumber Inspector Log Mark Records, Wisconsin Lumber District #6, the Chippewa River, 1886 to 1881, 92 pages.

The records were hand copied by Gordon Morse and his wife from Bruce, Wisconsin and later typed up by his law office. In a letter to me he said that the hand written record book was very hard to read and he used question marks on the spelling of names in a number of places. Whenever the same end mark or bark mark also shows up in my 6B record and the spelling of names is similar but not exactly the same, I use the spelling in my records using the one from Series #916 because I have photocopies of those 131 pages.

My Code 6B from the W.S.H.S. State Archives Record, Series #916, Log Mark Record Book, Wisconsin Lumber District #6. Chippewa River, 1875 to 1918. Many of the marks are recorded in chronological order from the log mark records 1864 to 1881, Volume 1, series 1074. Cross reference number of the marks often refers to the Log Mark Record Book 1875-1901 in Miscellaneous Papers, Box 1, Series #1067. Occasional references are made to \_\_\_\_\_\_(?) and \_\_\_\_\_\_(?) and contracts recorded in Lumber District #6 Miscellaneous Records, Volumes 10 and 11, Series 1068.

My Code 6C, Wisconsin Lumber District #6, Chippewa River, "Herr Ole Evans Notebook" from the Alma Historical Society. Apparently Mr. Evans was in charge of the sorting works at Buffalo. I could not get any information about Mr. Evans, what company ran the sorting works at Buffalo or where it was on the Chippewa River. I have photocopies of the 127 pages.

My Code 6D - occasional information of a mark from somewhole else or myself not recorded enter. In alker places.
