## Park Falls Paper Mill Gets Sold in Parts; Auction Dismantles Plant, Cuts Off Chances for a New Owner to Run it Again

Since early summer the community of Park Falls has been hoping for a boost from the state of Wisconsin that would enable the city's shuttered paper mill to hang on, find new owners and reopen. Last week the door closed on that option as machinery and equipment from the Park Falls Pulp & Paper plant was auctioned off. Invoices from the auction have gone out and winning bidders have begun to pick up their purchases, Park Falls Mayor Michael Bablick said Monday. *Read More* 

#### Struggling to Save the Park Falls Paper Mill

Over three days in the middle of November, online auctioneers sold off bits and pieces of the paper mill that for a century has anchored the city of Park Falls in northern Wisconsin. The auction began just days after the Wisconsin Assembly passed a bill to steer a \$15 million loan guarantee to prospective buyers who Park Falls officials and others hoped would keep the Park Falls Pulp & Paper mill intact and reopen it with a new business plan that could preserve some of the highest-paying jobs in Price County. *Read More* 

#### Milwaukee Will Soon be Home to the Tallest Mass Timber Structure in the World

MILWAUKEE — Milwaukee will soon be home to the tallest mass timber structure in the world.

That will be a reality when contractors top off the new Ascent apartment building next month. The structure is slated to be complete by August of 2022. The building will be 284 feet tall and contain 259 apartments. But the most notable aspect of the structure is that it is built from mass timber, meaning it was constructed using a variety of pieces of wood slabs connected together - instead of the traditional concrete and steel. *Read More*

## Visiting Woodchips Embedded Links to Webpages

Hyperlinks embedded into Woodchips allow readers to enjoy featured video or audio presentations as well full news articles or papers of interest with just a simple click of their mouse. The links appear at the end of an article (a news headline with one or two introductory sentences) typically as *Watch Video*, *Read More*, or *For More Information*.

To open the link, place your cursor over <u>Watch Video</u> or <u>Read More</u> and so on, and then left click on your mouse. That should open the link in a new window providing access to the specifically linked webpage.

With this issue of Woodchips, we will start listing the full URL to each hyperlink on a second page. If needed, the URL can be copied and pasted into your web browser address bar (also known as location bar or URL bar).
