## Did the Pandemic DrIve Up Wood Product Costs?

During the first year of the COVID-19 pandemic, prices of processed wood products, such as softwood lumber and plywood, nearly quadrupled, according to a report from the Southern Research Station of the United States Department of Agriculture. In a report by Virginia McDaniel of the USDA, she said that wholesale prices for plywood increased from \$400 to \$1500 per thousand square feet (roughly equivalent to retail prices of plywood increasing from about \$12.80 to \$48.00 per sheet). *Read More* 

## **Success: Oak Seeding Restores Forest**

A derecho storm in July 2019 ravaged much of northern Wisconsin. Almost 250,000 acres were impacted throughout the state. The heaviest-hit areas included Polk, Barron, Oconto and Lincoln counties. The 120-acre Jorgenson family forest was directly in the storm's path; most of the forestland was severely damaged. Rod Jorgenson took action; he began a salvage logging process to remove downed and damaged timber. The western edge of the forest, consisting of a northern-hardwood mix, was the most critically damaged, with almost 100 percent tree mortality. *Read More*

#### <u>Visiting Woodchips Embedded Links to Webpages</u>

Hyperlinks embedded into Woodchips allow readers to enjoy featured video or audio presentations as well full news articles or papers of interest with just a simple click of their mouse. The links appear at the end of an article (a news headline with one or two introductory sentences) typically as <u>Watch Video</u>, <u>Read More</u>, or <u>For More Information</u>.

To open the link, place your cursor over <u>Watch Video</u> or <u>Read More</u> and so on, and then left click on your mouse. That should open the link in a new window providing access to the specifically linked webpage.

With this issue of Woodchips, we will start listing the full URL to each hyperlink on a second page. If needed, the URL can be copied and pasted into your web browser address bar (also known as location bar or URL bar).
