Abiah was a schooner launched in late summer 1847 in Irving, New York. It operated in the Great Lakes grain and lumber trades during its career. *Read More* 

# Logjams Benefit Wildlife So Much That Scientists Are Intentionally Placing Wood in Streams

When a large chunk of wood sits in a stream, it offers benefits to the creatures around it. New research finds it's not just fish, but other wildlife that take advantage of the wood too. Researchers were curious how logjams and floating wood could have an impact on animals in the ecosystem. *Read More* 

# This Supercharged Tree Might Help Fight Climate Change

The problem with trees is that they are too slow. Part of the issue with catastrophic climate change is that, by some measures, an incredible amount of damage is already done. Even if all the coal-fired power plants were magically turned into wind and solar overnight, and all our cars were electric, all the greenhouse gases that we pumped into our atmosphere for 200 years would still be there. Trees could, theoretically, help fix that. As they grow, they absorb carbon dioxide from the atmosphere and, long story short, turn it into wood. But many trees only grow a foot or less per year. To not just halt climate change, but actually reverse it, someone would have to invent a tree that can grow much, much faster. *Read More*

#### <u>Visiting Woodchips Embedded Links to Webpages</u>

Hyperlinks embedded into Woodchips allow readers to enjoy featured video or audio presentations as well full news articles or papers of interest with just a simple click of their mouse. The links appear at the end of an article (a news headline with one or two introductory sentences) typically as *Watch Video*, *Read More*, or *For More Information*.

To open the link, place your cursor over <u>Watch Video</u> or <u>Read More</u> and so on, and then left click on your mouse. That should open the link in a new window providing access to the specifically linked webpage.

With this issue of Woodchips, we will start listing the full URL to each hyperlink on a second page. If needed, the URL can be copied and pasted into your web browser address bar (also known as location bar or URL bar).
