Introduction to Identification and Ecology of Northeastern Conifers

Conifer trees are a common feature of woodlots, forests and landscapes. The value and qualities of trees are determined in part by the type of tree. Knowing the principles of tree identification will help owners appreciate the value of trees and the types of benefits those trees might provide. This presentation will cover the core principles of tree identification, including how to use twigs, buds, bark, fruit, growth habit, habitat (and even leaves) for identification. Knowledge of these principles will help participants learn how to identify a wide range of trees. Several common trees will be used to illustrate the principles. *Watch Video*

Milwaukee Brewery Makes City Christmas Tree into Beer

Tucked behind a nursing home and water treatment plant, the 32-acre Holmboe Conifer Forest State Natural Area meanders along-side the Pelican River in Rhinelander. "This is just gloriously beautiful," says John Bates, as he leads a hiking group through the forest. "It is spectacular, I think." The interpretative hike is in celebration of the area's induction to the Old-Growth Forest Network, a program to identify and protect publicly accessible old-growth forests throughout the country. <u>Read More</u>

People, Fire and Pines: How Fire Use by the Anishinaabeg Shaped the Boundary Waters

During the summer of 2021, the Border Lakes Region between Minnesota and Ontario experienced one of its most active fire seasons in recent history. In Ontario's Quetico Provincial Park, more than 123,000 acres burned – fully 14% of the park's area. In the Superior National Forest in Minnesota, wildfires burned over 30,000 acres, including in the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness. There, hundreds of wildland firefighters were part of a 31 million dollar effort to suppress these blazes, despite many of the fires occurring in a federal wilderness with special protections under the Wilderness Act of 1964 that define these lands as "untrammeled by man." <u>Visiting Woodchips Embedded Links to Webpages</u>

Hyperlinks embedded into Woodchips allow readers to enjoy featured video or audio presentations as well full news articles or papers of interest with just a simple click of their mouse. The links appear at the end of an article (a news headline with one or two introductory sentences) typically as *Watch Video*, *Read More*, or *For More Information*.

To open the link, place your cursor over <u>Watch Video</u> or <u>Read More</u> and so on, and then left click on your mouse. That should open the link in a new window providing access to the specifically linked webpage.

With this issue of Woodchips, we will start listing the full URL to each hyperlink on a second page. If needed, the URL can be copied and pasted into your web browser address bar (also known as location bar or URL bar).
