# **The Giving Forest**

Menominee County, — Amid the sprawling farmlands of northeast Wisconsin, the Menominee forest feels like an elixir, and a marvel. Its trees press in, towering and close, softening the air, a dense emerald wilderness that's home to wolves, bears, otters, warblers and hawks, and that shows little hint of human hands. Yet over the last 160 years, much of this forest has been chopped down and regrown nearly three times. The Menominee Tribe of Wisconsin, its stewards, have pulled nearly two hundred million cubic feet of timber from this land since 1854 — white pine cut into museum displays and hard maple made into basketball courts for the Olympics. <u>*Read More*</u>

# Trillion Tree Pledge: More than 12.9 Million Trees Planted in Wisconsin Last Year

Ahead of Earth Day on Saturday, April 22, Governor Tony Evers and the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) released an annual report regarding Wisconsin's progress on the Trillion Tree Pledge. On Earth Day 2021, Evers signed Executive Order #112, joining the global Trillion Tree Pledge and committing to plant 75 million new trees in rural and urban areas and conserve 125,000 acres of forest in Wisconsin by 2030 in collaboration with public, private and non-governmental partners. <u>Read More</u>

Stevens Point— Artist Christopher Sweet (Ho-Chunk) wanted his new mural at UW-Stevens Point to represent the four nations of people who had been unceremoniously buried and forgotten under that campus. His mural, "Awaken the Healing," was installed this spring on an outside wall of the university's communication arts center building and was blessed by a tribal ceremony and ghost feast last week. ## Legislature's Finance Committee Rejects Funding for Wisconsin's Largest Land Conservation Effort

Wisconsin's largest land conservation effort is \$4 million short after the Legislature's finance committee voted against using money from the state's land purchase program for the project on Tuesday. The move is a setback for the state's plans to set aside 70,000 acres east of Rhinelander for the Pelican River Forest in northern Wisconsin. The Department of Natural Resources must now come up with other funds if it hopes to match a \$10.8 million federal grant and keep the project alive. The agency has previously said it may need to seek a landowner donation or launch a fundraising campaign if stewardship funds were unavailable. <u>Read More</u>

## 'Our ancestors have lived on these lands for thousands of years,' Michigan Tribe Signs Tribal Forest Protection Act

The Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians last week signed a Tribal Forest Protection Act proposal with the Hiawatha National Forest. The proposal acts as a co-stewardship agreement and includes a \$364,000 investment from the U.S. Department of Agriculture to support co-stewardship activities in managing the health of remnant boreal forest ecosystems in Michigan's Upper Peninsula, encompassing 4.7 million acres, which includes significant portions of the 879,000-acre Hiawatha National Forest.

#### Visiting Woodchips Embedded Links to Webpages

Hyperlinks embedded into Woodchips allow readers to enjoy featured video or audio presentations as well full news articles or papers of interest with just a simple click of their mouse. The links appear at the end of an article (a news headline with one or two introductory sentences) typically as <u>Watch Video</u>, <u>Read More</u>, or <u>For More Information</u>.

To open the link, place your cursor over <u>Watch Video</u> or <u>Read More</u> and so on, and then left click on your mouse. That should open the link in a new window providing access to the specifically linked webpage.

With this issue of Woodchips, we will start listing the full URL to each hyperlink on a second page. If needed, the URL can be copied and pasted into your web browser address bar (also known as location bar or URL bar).
