ALONG THE ST. LOUIS RIVER — For more than a decade now, since emerald ash borers were first discovered in Minnesota and Wisconsin, the shiny green insects from Asia have been mostly an urban problem, munching away and killing ash trees in cities and suburbs where some neighborhoods have lost most of their shade. Now, slowly but surely, a new chapter in the insect's invasion is opening as they make their move into the forests of northern Minnesota and Wisconsin where millions of acres of black ash trees await. *Read More*

Minnesota Timber Framer Helping to Rebuild Notre Dame Cathedral

GRAND MARAIS, Minn. -- A carpenter from Minnesota is using his woodworking skills to help rebuild the famous Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris. A devastating fire tore through the roof four years ago. When flames engulfed Notre Dame in 2019, French President Emmanuel Macron vowed to resurrect the iconic cathedral within five years. Four years in, architects are celebrating a huge step toward restoration as they raise the first portion of a massive oak framework in a workshop in western France. *Read More*

DNR: Summer Spongy Moth Outbreak Could be Worst in More Than Ten Years

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is warning the public that the next two months could bring the worst spongy moth caterpillar outbreak in more than a decade. Invasive spongy moth caterpillars, formerly known as gypsy moth, strip trees of their leaves, potentially killing high-value trees. They prefer to feed on oak, birch, crabapple, aspen and willow leaves but will also feed on many other tree and shrub species. *Read More*

Thousands of people in Quebec, Canada evacuated their homes this month due to raging wildfires. More than 400 miles away, New York City experienced its worst air quality in history, and briefly had the worst air quality of any city in the world. <u>Visiting Woodchips Embedded Links to Webpages</u>

Hyperlinks embedded into Woodchips allow readers to enjoy featured video or audio presentations as well full news articles or papers of interest with just a simple click of their mouse. The links appear at the end of an article (a news headline with one or two introductory sentences) typically as *Watch Video*, *Read More*, or *For More Information*.

To open the link, place your cursor over <u>Watch Video</u> or <u>Read More</u> and so on, and then left click on your mouse. That should open the link in a new window providing access to the specifically linked webpage.

With this issue of Woodchips, we will start listing the full URL to each hyperlink on a second page. If needed, the URL can be copied and pasted into your web browser address bar (also known as location bar or URL bar).
