More Buildings Are Using Mass Timber. Could it Boost Wisconsin's Forest Industry?

An emerging technology in lumber could have implications for Wisconsin's forestry industry. Mass timber is a process of strengthening wood, typically by gluing panels together to create dense layers of wood called cross-laminated timber or CLT. CLT is "essentially plywood on steroids," said Alex Anderson, forest products specialist for the state Department of Natural Resources. Watch For Woodpecker Damage On Ash Trees

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) encourages property owners to watch for woodpecker damage to their ash trees this winter. Woodpecker damage, often called "flecking," happens when birds peck away some of a tree's bark to access the larvae underneath. Flecking is a common early sign that an ash tree might be infested with emerald ash borer (EAB), an invasive insect. EAB is the most damaging threat to Wisconsin trees, killing more than 99% of the untreated ash trees it infests. [Read More](#)
